

Our behaviour policy



Our revised behaviour policy was implemented in September 2022 and is based on the principals from the book. 'When the Adults Change'.



Our principles



We have a positive and predictable approach to behaviour management where we:

- Deliberately and persistently catch children doing the right thing and praise them in front of others.
- Know the children well and develop positive, emotionally rich relationships with all children.
- Demonstrate calm and consistent adult behaviour.
- ✓ Demonstrate unconditional care and compassion.
- ✓ Use the language of values and rules consistently.

Our rules



Positive approach through our 3 simple rules:

- □ Ready
- □ Respectful
- □ Safe



Our expectations



Good behaviour doesn't just happen.

We have clear routines and expectations so the adults and children know what is expected of them at:

- The beginning of the day.
- Playtimes
- Lunchtimes
- □ Assembly
- In the classroom

Expectations are introduced and then revisited regularly through class discussions, assemblies and at opportune times throughout the day so that they become routine.

Consistency



In order to aid consistency across the school:

- Year groups meet weekly to plan and discuss the behaviours that are going well and what children need to work on.
- We have weekly assemblies with a behaviour focus that the whole school is working on.

Positive noticing



We want children to choose to make good choices and these are recognised through 'positive noticing'.

- Well done James. You are walking so smartly.
- Great manners Lilly. I heard you say thank you.
- Thank you for standing behind your chair so smartly.

Rewards – when children go over and above







What if rules aren't followed?



- No shame approach
- Discrete
- Be clear about what we are expecting
- Reminders
- Time with the adult to talk through the behaviour and what they could do next time.
- Individual behavior plans
- You will be informed by your child's class teacher if there are concerns about your child's behaviour.
