


Values @ home

The value for November is **Unity**! We have been learning that we will much more successful if we work together! This might mean working with a partner, helping your family, working as a class or even as part of Oatlands school.

Below is a fun activity you can try at home with your child as a way of thinking about unity.



- Cut out a large circle from a sheet of paper. (You can use the rim of a plate as a template to draw the circle and then cut it out).
- 2. Fold the circle in half three times (in half, into quarters, and then into eights). You will get a pie-piece shape.
- 3. Draw out two half-figures as shown. In this example, half a boy is on the left and half a girl is on the right. It is easier to have the heads pointing in towards the centre of the circle and the feet pointing out towards the perimeter.
- 4. Cut out the figures and unfold. You will find 8 figures holding hands to form a complete circle.
- 5. On each figure draw or write what unity means to you? For example: Unity is sharing. Unity is listening.
